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

Shibuya still retains some of the retro scenes of the previous century. The atmosphere of Shibuya Nonbei Yokocho (drunkard's alley), a popular spot in the city to get together with old friends and meet new people, transports visitors back in time. Koichiro Mikuriya, who serves as the PR manager for Nonbei Yokocho and runs the izakaya pub Aizu, says that the appeal of yokocho culture lies in how “people from all walks of life gather together in narrow spaces. You’ll see, for example, a spot run by an 84-year-old grandmother next to a place packed with young men and women in their 20s, and next to that, an establishment popular with the international crowd.”

### 06 Hang out The place to go after a hard day's work!

Shibuya may be an urban district, but it also offers plenty of spaces where you can relax and look up at the sky. Yoyogi Park, which spans an area of 54 hectares, is full of lush trees and other natural features. You can get your fill of nature while listening to bubbling streams and birdsong. Meanwhile, the rooftop of MIYASHITA PARK features a 1,000-square-meter lawn with adjoining cafe where visitors can relax with a cup of coffee in hand. SHIBUYA SCRAMBLE SQUARE opened with the featured facility SHIBUYA SKY 229m above the ground. One of the largest rooftop observation deck in Japan offers a 360-degree panoramic views.

### 01 Hang out Experience art and culture in Shibuya

Shibuya is home to a huge number of places to enjoy art, from classical art museums to galleries showcasing more contemporary works. Ota Memorial Museum of Art, which specializes in ukiyo-e woodblock prints, Yamatane Museum of Art, dedicated to Japanese paintings, Kokugakuin University Museum, which exhibits archaeological and Shinto-related artifacts, and other classical cultural facilities stand close to large-scale wall art displayed on the exterior walls of Shibuya Hikarie on the fourth floor. In addition, visitors can readily encounter a wide variety of art at places such as the Toguri Museum of Art, which showcases East Asian ceramics, and Shibuya Station, home to Taro Okamoto's giant mural Myth of Tomorrow.

Or for something more traditional, how about the ‘Cerulean Tower Noh Theatre’? Tokyo Comedy Bar, on the other hand, offers stand-up comedy together with craft beer.
